Competitors will be warned verbally and in the Final Details to take extra care at this junction, particularly when egressing the track. (KH) Marshals will supervise and control entrance to & exit from the parking site through the single track (KH) Car park marshalled by at least four competent persons. (KH) Vehicles parked on one side of two tracks and at various places within the quarry area with adequate space to enable them to manoeuvre safely (KH). Most competitors will be warned on the Final Details and by the Start Marshalls.
