VENUE and PARKING

Beverley is an historic town with medieval buildings, market squares and narrow streets and alleys. There is a mixture of cafes, pubs, well known and independent shops plus sculptures and paintings which form the Town Trail and Elwell Trail.

The Assembly area is adjacent to the Market Cross in "Saturday Market" in the heart of the town centre (TA 033 397). Parking is in any of the town centre car parks including

adjacent to assembly (Parking is free on Sundays). SAT NAV for Assembly is (N 53 50 35; W 00 25 49) Bags and clothing may be left in the Assembly Area.

REGISTRATION

10am to 12 noon.

STARTS

Starts and finishes will be within the Assembly area.

10:30am to 12:30

Courses close at 2:30pm

ENTRY FEES

Enter on line at www.fabian4.co.uk (until May 20)

Seniors £8.00 (£2 discount for BOF members)

Juniors £3.00 (£2 on Course D and E)

e-punch hire £1.00

Entry on the day subject to map availability - add £1 for adults.

COURSES

A -- 6 km approx (M Open; M40+) **B** - 5 km approx (W Open; W40+; M55+) **C** - 3.5 km approx (W55+; M65+; W65+)

 $\mathbf{D} - 2 \text{ km}$ approx (M16-; W16-)

E – 1 km approx (M12-; W12-) Yellow standard

Distances are approximate straight line distances; actual distances can be 50% longer. Competitors can enter any course, but to be competitive in the 2012 YHOA Urban

League, they must enter the applicable course for their age group.

M/W 16 and under will only be allowed on Course D and E for safety reasons. Parents should be aware that even this course will cross roads with light traffic. M/W 16's will only be allowed to run up if they have passed their sixteenth birthday on the

day of the race.

TERRAIN

Courses A to C will take place, in and around Beverley Town Centre consisting of roads, alleyways, pedestrianised areas and open spaces. The courses will visit many of this

pleasant market town's attractions including The Minster.

Course D and E will take place in the pedestrianised area and quiet streets adjacent to

the town centre.
