



Shoe Disinfectant	All competitors must disinfect the soles of their shoes in the loaded tray provided. The landowner, Mr. Ashwin, has many ash trees on his land which would be vulnerable to infection without this precaution. Thank you.				
Dogs	Dogs are permitted at this event on leads in the assembly/car parking areas. This is a sheep farming area.				
Safety	Orienteering is an adventure sport – competitors are responsible for their own safety, and take part at their own risk. Competitors travelling alone should leave their car keys and particulars at Registration. Whistles should always be carried when orienteering. Cagoules may be made compulsory in the event of adverse weather conditions. First Aid & details of nearest A&E will be available from Registration.				
Pheasant Pens	NB - fenced enclosures (pheasant pens) - care needed. There are some head/neck high wires and/or ropes supporting the fence posts. The wires or guy ropes (3-5 metres long) are attached to nearby trees at head height so care is needed if you decide to run near the enclosures. They are wisely avoided.				
Man info					
Map info	 A black cross on the map is a tripod. A black cross is used in control descriptions for a tripod. There are many piles of logs at the side of tracks which the mapper has marked with a short dark green line. It is shown on the legend which is on the map. 				
OOB	Cultivated land is out of bounds (shown with the black dot yellow screen)				
Crossing points	Most fences on the map are marked as crossable but in practice are difficult to cross with two strands of barbed wire at the top. Please use the crossing points marked with barrier tape and overprinted on the map; some are stiles and some are gates which the farmer has left open purposely or left closed.				
Gates NB	If you open a gate, you must close it behind you please , as it is likely that there will be livestock in the area. This affects the longer courses only.				
Yellow course	The Yellow course has a short taped route from control 6 to the edge of a field. Competitors should follow the tapes and then follow the edge of the field to control 7. These instructions are included on the control descriptions and there will be a sign at each end of the tapes.				
New planting	Near the main start there are some areas of newly planted trees - please take care if you run through them.				
Descriptions	The White, Yellow, Orange & Long Orange have written descriptions, all other courses
