TRAVEL	The entrance to the Country Park is at SE887168, in the village of Normanby approx 6km north of Scunthorpe. (Postcode DN15 9HU) The park is well sign posted from the Humber Bridge and M181 with brown tourist information signs.
	Parking will be in a level field (£1 per car)
ENTRY and FEES	Entry is on the Day only. Seniors £5.00 Juniors/Students £2.00 <i>Electronic timing will be in use</i> ( <i>e-punch</i> hire - £1.00, free for schools competitors) School groups are asked to email the organiser (fixtures@halo-orienteering.org.uk) with approximate group size.
	All children entered should be able to read an orienteering map competently and be confident in using basic navigational techniques and should have competed in a previous orienteering event. (Contact Organiser if clarification required)
REGISTRATION	10am to 12 noon. Registration will be in one of the Park's Classrooms.
STARTS	Starts and finishes will be within 500m of the parking area.

TERRAIN	The area consists of the Normanby Hall Country Park with parkland and mixed woodland. The longer courses will visit the adjacent Community Woodland which has a variety of cover, including mature trees; areas of new plantations in different stages of growth; fast open and rough open areas.
